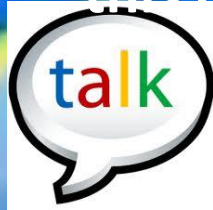

# Essential Questions, Objectives and Standards.....

Essential Question: What was Kipling's purpose in writing the Jungle Book stories and how did he use the poems he included?



## Objectives:

The student will identify the main purpose of “The Jungle Book” stories. The student will define foreshadowing and identify how it is used in “The Jungle Book” stories.

## Standards:

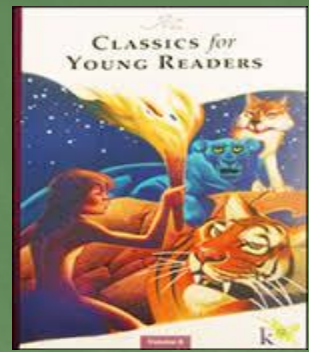
# Open-ended Question
